

Far Cry Primal just feels like an old piece of chewing gum. Good quality chewing gum, but the taste has worn off a long time ago.

It has all the ingredients you would expect from a Far Cry episode. It looks amazing, you get to hunt, upgrade your weapons, unlock a bunch of nice stuff, free outposts, search for collectibles, kill lots of tribesman, gather plants. All very nice and all.....but....We know all that stuff...ther is no surprise anywhere. It took me about half an hour to "get" this game. Half an hour to understand what direction this game would be going.

At first i was excited to hunt for some prey. I wanted to feel like a stoneage hunter who stalks his prey and outsmart it using the right type of weapon and using the landscape in my advantage.....Well....Far Cry gives you a big f#ck you in that regard. Instead of smart A.I. it just gives you numbers.....I mean life is literally everywhere. Walk for one minute and you'll encounter 20 goats, 15 deer, 10 wolves, 6 lions, 3 sabretooth tigers, a bunch of wooly mammoths and some people of friendly and enemy tribes. It does not feel like an actual jungle where the absence of obvious danger makes it all the more exiting. The thought there could be a dangerous animal around the corner is way more scary than being a 100% sure there is a dangerous animal.

The storyline is thin and characters are not to interesting. The NPC's give you tasks and you will do this tasks. That's about it. They've tried to make the NPC's weird or funny of tough, but you never get a "relationship" with them. Thet is no real character development and emotionally I would not give a single f#ck if the NPC would have died horrible deaths.

The language they speak sounds good and authentic, the voice acting however not always so spot on. For example "Urki the thinker" is a somewhat funny guy who does dumb things (won't spoil). But you can clearly hear an american redneck accent in his pronuciation. Maybe Far Cry's creators have done this on purpose to match his stupidity, but it just not works for me.

I have not finished the main story yet and I don't know if I will be finishing it. I kinda lost interest and at this point it's beginning to feel more and more like a chore than something I realy want to do.

My verdict: 6,5/10

Buy it when it's on sale. Too expensive and could be prettier. However, the racing is fun and acing a corner or a section of corners feels very satisfying. Recommended but at half the price.. Very poor game. Yes, you can argue that the art is nice and the music is almost good, but everything needed to create a good story is lacking in this game. The first play through you're almost interested, waiting for action or a proper climax, but you're let down and the game ends. So you figure, okay, maybe I just made bad decsions being that there are 21 other endings. In less than an hour I've unlocked six different endings and none of them are better than the last. The characters are poorly developed, a connection between the player and the character aren't developed, scenes and dialogue are heavily repetitive, many times there are little variation between endings, some choices lead you in a circle which is tedious, and every ending is abrupt and unsatisfying. I highly warn against playing this game, even if it was free, it still wouldn't be worth it. I had high hopes from this game and each and every time I was let down. The only reason I will continue to play it, is to simply complete the game because I've already started.

Overall, True Lover's Knot is a disappointment. While the concept is interesting, the game does not live up to the potential in it. While I could forgive the fact that the background art and the character art don't always mesh well, the shallowness of the characters and the lack of gameplay options do the game in. With such a small cast of characters, I expected much more depth and personality. Two of the characters could be removed completely and not affect anything. I also found Santi both extremely distasteful and rather creepy which leads into my other major problem with the game. The lack of gameplay choices. For example, I can't choose to avoid Santi all together and go on the tour with Lucas instead. There's even a part where the choice to return to the cruise ship just cycles me through the same dialogue until I agree to spend the night with Santi. I did appreciate the fact that I could choose not to end up with either of the love interests, but it wasn't enough to save the game for me, and because there are only three ending options, the replay value of the game is extremely limited. The puzzles within the game also don't add much to the experience and are extremely repetitive. If you're looking for a good visual novel style game, this isn't it.. This is awesome. Got it with the Humble Bundle for Android 5. Controls are a bit too awkward on my phone but the Steam code for it for my PC was well worth the price of admission.
